How To Apply: **Auxiliarists:** Contact the active duty training officer at your sector or unit for a submission form
Students who have previously attended MST-A School or the Entry Level Port Operations Course (MS 401 or MS 401A) have fulfilled the needs of this course. MST rated members are not required to attend this course. Members should have completed the Initial Indoctrination Marine Safety (IIMS) correspondence course. These requirements are for all active and reserve Coast Guard personnel and Coast Guard Auxiliary requesting this Course.

Prerequisites: **Auxiliarists:** (*no waivers for any of the below requirements*)

1. Completion of the Initial Indoctrination Marine Safety (IIMS) correspondence course
2. Completion of the Introduction to Marine Safety course (Intro-MS/MEP)
3. Completion of the Good Mate course
4. Completion of ICS 100 course
5. Active participation in the pollution response field (working on their marine safety qualifications - Ass't Pollution Investigator or Ass't Pollution Response Specialist)

** Auxiliarist selections will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis by CG-3RPP and CG-3PCA

Purpose

This entry level training provides oil and hazardous material response and investigation training for personnel assigned to pollution response duties. Subject areas include oil and chemical properties, personal protective equipment, pollution response authority, pollution investigations, oil spill cleanup techniques, HAZWOPER, ICS 210, and MISLE. Course emphasizes on an all hazards approach to Incident Response.
